Note: A higher rank means a lower number. A class rank of 3 is higher than a class rank of 5.

1. The recipient of the Chemistry award was 3 ranks higher than Desmond, who was a higher rank than Mr. Ford, who was three ranks higher than Elizabeth.
2. Sheila Stone wasn't presented with the Mathematics award.
3. The person ranked in 9th place didn't have a last name of Brown.
4. Marcus didn't receive the History award.
5. Mr. Carter, whose first name wasn't Marcus, was presented with the Theater & Music award but he wasn't ranked in 12th place.
6. The student, who wasn't Desmond, presented with the History award had a last name of Brown. Oliver's rank wasn't in 6th place but he was presented with the Russian award.
