4. Marvin Wood didn't suggest Hamlet. One of the teachers suggested Romeo and Juliet.
5. Camelot, with 82 votes, came in after the winning play, which had 106 votes.
6. The students were the person whose last name was Thatch and the person who suggested the play, Oliver.
